The Staff Parish Relations Committee assigns each member to be a liaison to a staff member. I'm assigned to Rev. Tezenlo. Each member will be writing a profile for the newsletter. Here's my profile on Rev. Tezenlo.

Many of you know the story of Tezenlo's journey toward Simpson UMC, but here's a re-cap. He was born and went through school and college in Nagaland (in Northeast India near the tri-border of China, Myanmar, and India). It's similar in elevation to Denver, but more humid. So, it's after college that things move into hyperspace... he goes to South Korea for a Masters degree, meets and marries Eungjung Han, and they have their first child, a daughter, Soye (now a senior at Smoky Hill High School—time flies!). Then the family of three moves to Bangalore, India where their son Yechan is born (and he's now a junior at Smoky Hill).

But wait, the international journey is just beginning... then the four of them make the big jump across the Pacific, and over mountains and plains to Kansas City to attend the Central Baptist Theological Seminary. So by the time their third child, a son, Nako is born, the five of them are here in the USA. So... at their breakfast table each morning, not only is most of our Simpson Youth Group represented, but with family members born in four different countries, it's a kind of Pacific Rim Alliance.

Joking aside, Tezenlo has serious work to do here at Simpson UMC. He has stepped up to the challenge of being a jack-of-all-trades in his ministerial duties, but he finds it the most rewarding to be able to meet the needs of the people who are grieving or otherwise in need. He enjoys making a difference in the small things and joining with others to act with grace and compassion. His question to the congregation is, what is the difference we are making today? He would like to see Simpson UMC become viable and vibrant again and to carry on its legacy in being God's hands and feet. We are lucky to have Tezenlo to lead us in this task.

Knitting, Crochet, Sewing Outreach Update

Members of the Simpson congregation have been very busy since last February. On October 3rd we delivered forty-four hats, fifteen scarves, and 4 pairs of baby socks to Knit Knack (in old town Arvada) where they were sent on to Knit-ting4Peace/Community Purls. In addition we donated 2 pairs of mittens to Rev. Matt's wife's elementary school (with more on the way), and hats to the Cancer Clinic at University Hospital.

I am grateful and proud of this church community. So many have given of their time, supplies, talents, laughter, and fellowship. Our love will spread throughout the local community and the world.

Knitting4peace/Community Purls is an organization that distributes handmade items to our local community as well as around the world. Local organizations include Family Promise of Greater Denver, Fletcher Community School, Daybreak Café, and the Women's Homelessness Initiative as well as many others. Members of Knitting4peace knit, crochet, weave, and sew as an outward and visible sign of our real work: knitting together the global Beloved Community. Knitting4peace states they are a grass-roots intergenerational organization dedicated to crafting hope, healing and peace one stitch at a time through non-violent compassionate action. They are committed to the well-being of women and children they may never meet; they plant seeds of hope for a future we will never see. They are non-violent revolutionaries armed with the power of prayer, crochet hooks, sewing machines, and knitting needles, engaged in a compassionate fight for hope, healing, justice and peach for all women and children. I can't think of any better organization to receive the fruits Simpson's labors and fellowship.

Let's plan on making another delivery in January. I have purchased some knitting looms that I will bring to our November 1st gathering. So if you don't feel like you can knit or crochet or sew using a knitting loom may be the perfect answer. Come join us the first and third Sundays of the month right after church... we serve a light lunch, show off our progress, and get to know each other.
