I hope your summer is going well. So many things are happening every day around the nation and the world that sometimes even the 24-hour news networks cannot cover all. Similarly, many things have happened to our larger United Methodist Church since May 2016, when we had our quadrennial General Conference in Portland, OR. Following that, in June, our Rocky Mountain Conference had an Annual Conference gathering in Westminster, CO. Then in July, Jurisdictional Conferences were held in various parts of the country. The United Methodist being a connectional church, decisions made during these events have their impact on local churches.

The United Methodist is a global church. The Methodists in Africa, Asia and Europe are organized into seven “central conferences.” In the US, the UMC is divided into five areas known as jurisdictions. We belong to the Western Jurisdiction, which held its quadrennial gathering in July in Scottsdale, AZ. I’d like to share with you some of the decisions or news coming out of the Jurisdictional Conferences. First, episcopal assignments are determined by the Jurisdiction Episcopacy Committee every four years. As a result, our bishop, Bishop Elaine Stanovsky, has been assigned to serve the Alaska, Oregon-Idaho and Pacific Northwest conferences.

Second, Rev. Dr. Karen Oliveto, who was elected at the last Western jurisdictional conference due to Bishop Warner Brown’s retirement, will be our new bishop. She was elected on the 17th ballot by an overwhelming majority of 88 out of 100 votes. The assignment begins on September 1 of the year.

Third, several historic events took place in this year’s jurisdictional conferences. This year, the United Methodist elected the most women in any new class of bishops in its history. Four jurisdictions elected seven women bishops out of a total of fifteen. These breakthroughs are taking place as we approach the 60th anniversary of the Methodist Church granting full clergy rights to women. Also, Rev. Sharma Lewis was elected to be the first African-American woman to hold an episcopal leadership role in the Southeast Jurisdiction.

Finally, the Western Jurisdiction elected the Rev. Karen Oliveto, who is also the denomination’s first openly gay bishop. She serves as the senior pastor of Glide Memorial UMC in San Francisco, CA, and is married to her long-time partner, Robin Ridenour. Her election is a cause for celebration and joy for many and is seen as a triumph of justice and equality for all God’s children; while for others, it is a cause for worry and concern.

The issue of human sexuality is not new to the United Methodist Church. It has been the most contentious issue for the past several General Conferences. All I can say is that we have come a long way, but we still have miles to go. Let us continue to engage in conversation even as we strive to see God’s kingdom realize on earth.

2016 ROCKY MOUNTAIN ANNUAL CONFERENCE

June 9, - June 12, 2016

There was another amazing Annual Conference: inspirational, informative, and legislative! There were a dozen ongoing global and local projects/events on the table for action but I will only mention three of them.

+Should the Rocky Mountain Conference (Colorado, Utah, Wyoming) merge with the ailing Yellowstone Conference (Montana, Wyoming, Idaho)? Bigger is not always better and how many people would be able to travel six hours for a three hour meeting? Including the return trip, this would be a fifteen hour day. However, with modern technology, many professionals keep in touch with their constituents hour by hour, day by day from home electronically. The thoroughness of the procedure to determine if a merger is feasible is impressive: all the Churches in the Rocky Mountain Conference were able to vote; the Churches in the Yellowstone Conference will also be able to vote. This process will take four years. I worked in Wyoming; I drove to all the major towns; I drove for hours and hours and saw miles of plains and prairies. I voted “no” on this proposal.

+Want to see a medical miracle performed for \$35? You would be proud of the Methodist Church organization for what I am about to mention. In Haiti, people drink dirty contaminated water resulting in stomach pain, children missing school, and husbands unable to work. One out of seventy five people can expect to be dead in two years because of water born diseases. Enter “The Clean Water Ministries” and the Broomfield United Methodist Church. With a \$35.00 water filter from Cabelas attached to a tube and water bucket, a family of four can expect to have clean drinking water that is 99.9998% pure for seven years. Because of what the Broomfield UMC has started, three Rotary Clubs and a Denver corporation have asked to join this ministry.

+The third event that stands out in my mind is Bishop Elaine Stanovsky blessing an Iraqi refugee by washing his feet and his wife’s feet. The Bishop was emotional and there were not many dry eyes in the audience. His name is Altaee Raad and his wife’s name is Hussin Shaima. He was an interpreter for our troops in Iraq and he succeeded in escaping to America and making his home in Denver. After their feet were washed, all of us at the Conference got our hands washed. Do you want them to speak at our Church? They said they would be happy to and I have their contact information.

This four-day Conference was another “Oh My Gosh” experience!. There were approximately 750 people in attendance from three states. I am inviting anybody to consider being the Lay Delegate to the 2017 Annual Conference next June 15-18 at the Denver Marriott Tech Center.
