What We Need Right Now is to Encourage One Another By Rev. Matt Snider

In the wake of the dramatic, unexpected conclusion to the recent presidential election, many are feeling anxious, frightened and dejected. The result certainly wasn't what was expected or predicted. The President-elect said things during the campaign that have left people wondering whether the United States is veering in the direction of nativism and fascism and on the path to civil war. Let me assure you, I don't think we're any closer to civil war under Trump than we are under Obama but I understand if you feel that way based on the incendiary campaign rhetoric. There are passionate political feelings on both sides of the partisan divide and the most important thing we have to do is to remain calm, sensible, vigilant and responsive – and most importantly – respectful of one another. Decent people have different points of view and come to different political conclusions based on looking at the same set of facts. The essence of a democracy is to engage in respectful debate and remain engaged, not distance ourselves from one another.

At the core of our faith is the principle that God is ultimately in control of civilizations, indeed, the world. It would be difficult to think of God as sovereign if we could not think of God as on the throne and reigning. It is through the force of divine love that God moves the world in the direction of renewal, rebirth and regeneration. We are called to be the instruments of God's divine will, exemplifying the holy traits of mercy, justice and unconditional love for one another in the form of service to one another. Being political is not a function of our faith but being present to each other to meet our practical and spiritual needs is. We are called to be the *Corpus Christi*, the Body of Christ, in service to the world, not a unitary body politic.

As we begin the Advent journey on November 27, we need to be reminded yet again, that in the midst of the totalitarian rule of the Roman Empire, God broke through the overlapping layers of empire building and strong political and religious affections long ago to make a fundamental declaration that the powers of the world are nothing compared to the power of God. That should encourage us. That should give us hope. Our faith and focus should always be on God because God will never let us down nor abandon us. If you're worried about our nation's political situation, do something faith-full: pray. And then be the kind of person to others whom God expects us to be in Christ as our character is conformed to his image. Act like you have faith and as God perfects that faith, you will have the strength to encourage others, be encouraged and have hope for the future.

Romans 8:35-39 is the strongest, most hopeful declaration of God's love for us that continuously engages us when everything else looks bleak by comparison. Reflect on these words and "be of good cheer" because God is with us.

"Can anything ever separate us from Christ's love? Does it mean he no longer loves us if we have trouble or calamity, or are persecuted, or hungry, or destitute, or in danger, or threatened with death? As the Scriptures say, 'For your sake we are killed every day; we are being slaughtered like sheep.' No, despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who loved us. And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love. No power in the sky above or in the earth below—indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord."

This Christmas hymn is one of James Montgomery's favorite compositions. Montgomery, one of the greatest of the Moravian hymn writers, wrote the hymn in 1816 and it is considered one of the most challenging hymns ever written. The tune going under the name "Regent Square" was written by Henry Smart, a blind composer of London, England. His physical vision may have been impaired, but Smart could see as few men are able to see. From the combined vision of these two men has come one of the immortal Christmas classics.

2016 Staff Parish Relations Committee Summary

Our previous SPRC Chair, John Hall, served graciously for 2.25 years and the end was not in sight. Therefore, I volunteered to serve effective March, 2016 and the following were our endeavors.

• With 5 returning SPRC members and 3 serving their final year, the prospect of 1 and possibly 2 returnees in 2017 appeared daunting. Therefore, with 8 staff members, 3 additional new members were recruited to serve (bringing full committee to 8), allowing each staff member to have an SPRC liaison.

- Jenny Mahoney agreed to serve as Vice Chair & will be the Chair for 2017. This designation and this step early in the calendar year should aide in a smooth transition from year to year & also assure better communications from the Conference office to the church for relative and pertinent matters.
- This committee's members provided input to the Conference office regarding a pastoral evaluation in the spring.
- A guideline for the suggested duties and responsibilities of an SPRC liaison was written, approved, and adopted by the committee.
- Due to comments regarding a general lack of information regarding the staff shared with the congregation, a questionnaire was developed and given to the congregation to provide confidential input if they so chose. The committee agreed this form was to be shared with the congregation once each staff person was able to see/read the comments pertaining to their position.
- Shortly thereafter, an SPRC evaluation form was established, all committee members asked to provide input, the summary for each position then shared with the staff person by the assigned liaison person. A signed copy is in the SPRC notebook.
- In an effort to establish continuity and information to SPRC members, new and old on the committee, a "general information" loose leaf notebook has been established. The four notebooks are to be used by the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, and Sr. Pastor and hopefully kept current and passed to the respective individuals in years to follow. The notebook will have general SPRC guidelines, staff positions and date of hire, rate of pay, vacation/sick days if applicable, land job description to name a few.
- Also stemming from the liaison to staff contact, a pay scale and hours worked update was
 done. An SPRC budget analysis was done to also ensure adequate monies allocated for all
 positions to allow for the extra hours worked and not be scrambling to find a source to fund
 this extra cost.
- To open doors of communication, the chair person made a visit to a Church Staff meeting. I would like to suggest a continuation of these visitations.
- There is a computer program for sharing confidential information for this committee that Rev. Matt helped to set up. It was not implemented this year and in all probability will occur in 2017 under Jenny's guidance. Only SPRC members will have access to this program and the participants can be changed from year to year as needed.
- As in previous years, an SPRC Appreciation Holiday Dinner for the staff and their family will be held early in December.
- The liaisons for 2016 have been as follows: Pastor Tezenlo Thong—Pat Hayashi; Assistant Pastor Matt Snider –Jenny Mahoney; Mari Welch—Joe Hayashi; Lilly Quirk—Charlotte Namba; Chen Wu—Nancy Shock; Debbie Willeford—Dave Powell; Brenda Morris—Joel Nishida; Scott Pelletier—John Hall.

This has been a busy and productive year! It is with sincere appreciation that I have had the opportunity to serve on this committee with Tezenlo, Jenny, Joe, Charlotte, Nancy, Dave, Joel, and John.
