As I make preparations to begin my time with you at Simpson UMC, a song from a musical dances through my head:

Getting to know you, getting to know all about you; When I am with you, getting to know what to say. Getting to know you; putting it my way but nicely: you are precisely my cup of tea.

Now, these aren't exactly words of Scripture. But for me they capture the essence of what it means to be the Body of Christ. From the beginning, the Body of Christ consisted of people who cared enough to create good feelings and a sense of belonging with a new acquaintance simply because they had one thing in common: a love for Jesus Christ.

How exciting and challenging it must have been to be a Christian in those early years. Just think – a person from Algeria (the home of St. Augustine) could travel to Galatia (located in the eastern part of what is now Turkey) and be warmly welcomed by people who did not speak the same language, eat the same foods, or wear the same clothes. The one thing they had in common was a deep love for the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and that was enough to become friends.

It is in that same spirit that I look forward with joy to being among you, my new Christian friends. I'm sure that in the weeks to come we will all have moments when we are "getting to know what to say." But those moments will be guided by the Holy Spirit, whose deepest desire is to grow the Body of Christ through connecting us by His grace.

Perhaps the Apostle Paul, who boldly approached every community with the assumption that the love and grace of Jesus Christ would bring him new friends, said it best. So, I will leave you with his words, written to people he had never met: First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world. For God, whom I serve with my spirit by announcing the gospel of his Son, is my witness that without ceasing I remember you always in my prayers, asking that by God's will I may somehow at last succeed in coming to you. For I am longing to see you so that I may share with you some spiritual gift to strengthen you— or rather so that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine. (Romans 1:8-12)

Longing to see you – that sums it up nicely!
