"A light to lighten the Gentiles and the glory of thy people Israel..." – Luke 2:32 (KJV)

When Simeon, the very old righteous man waiting in the ancient Temple for the savior of Israel to appear, proclaimed the baby Jesus the Lord's Anointed One (the Christ, in Greek) when his parents presented him in the Temple on the 8th day following his birth, his proclamation that 'God was now with us' was a dramatic and radical one for the two kinds of people alive at the time. The world for the Jews was divided cleanly into two groups: Israel - everyone who was a descendent of Abraham through Issac and Jacob (whose name was changed to Israel after wrestling with the Angel of God) and everyone else - otherwise known as Gentiles... anyone who was a non-Jew. Simeon was waiting for Israel's deliverer, not someone with a larger mission.

Yet, at the same time, Simeon's proclamation heralded a new revelation for non-Jews. God was about to do something different for the rest of humanity, which wasn't included within the fold of the Abrahamic and Mosaic Covenants. This child was about to throw open the doors of the Covenant that had previously excluded them from the community of faith. God's revelatory message in the Incarnation is: everyone is welcome. The Apostle Paul summed it up very nicely. Let me paraphrase from the Letter to the Galatians: "the Law of Moses has brought me to the doorstep of righteousness but Christ opened the door to the Gospel of grace through salvation by faith."

Nothing underscores this expansion of God's gracious dealing with humanity more than the holiday of Epiphany. Celebrated on January 6 as a feast day on the Christian liturgical calendar, and also known at Three Kings Day, it commemorates the visit of the non-Jewish Magi to the baby Jesus, and thus, the revelation of the extension of God's grace to the Gentiles. Epiphany says "God is with us" – all of us – in a way that sometimes Christmas doesn't because Christmas, or Christ's Mass, is a distinctly Christian holiday.

The period after the Feast of Epiphany, which marks the end of the 12 days of Christmas, ushers in a period or season known to some denominations as Epiphanytide on the Christian liturgical calendar. This is the time between the Advent/Nativity season and the beginning of the Lenten season and, in some traditions, extends the Advent season until the commemoration of Christ's baptism. The most important thing to take away from observing Epiphany is that the revelation of God in Christ is a theophany, a manifestation of the Divine presence in the midst of humanity. During this period of Epiphany try to be spiritually aware of God's very real presence in the midst of your daily life. God did something very unique in the Incarnation. God declared "not only am I with you," but "there is only one 'you' – the community of humanity.

STORIES OF CHRISTIAN HYMNS

FAIREST LORD JESUS—Author Unknown

This famous hymn had its origin in Germany in the 17th century, and was discovered in America in the year 1850 by Richard Storrs Willis, a musician and newspaper man, who wrote books on church music and other musical subjects. The tune is an ancient Silesian folk song derived from legend and story, which is a ballad picturing common life with its interests and enthusiasm. It was said to have been sung by the German Knight Crusaders on their way to Jerusalem in the 12th Century and is still referred to as The Crusaders' Hymn, although no proof of this has been established. This hymn telling of the beauty of Nature is often called "The Marching song of the out-of-doors" and is a favorite of young people. It is also interesting to note that pianist Franz Liszt made large use of this tune in his oratorio "St. Elizabeth."

HOLY, HOLY! LORD GOD ALMIGHTY

Reginald Heber 1783-1826

One of the greatest hymns of all ages, "Holy, Holy, Holy" was written in 1826 by Bishop Reginald Heber. It was based on the meter of the Apocalypse as found in revelation 4:8-11: "Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God Almighty, which was and is, and is to come." The famed English poet—bishop wrote the hymn especially for Trinity Sunday as a tribute to the Trinity. It is one of the few hymns written for a specific Sunday of the Church Year, yet equally adaptable for every other Sunday. It is said of this hymn that it is found in more hymn books than any other hymn written.
