### Trustees Report 2016

The responsibilities of the Trustees seem to be "business as usual". We continue to maintain the property and monitor the financial accounts here at Simpson United Methodist Church. The boiler continues to provide the necessary heat for our winters and we continue to increase the boiler fund for its replacement. With the skill and knowledge of our senior member, Ken Namba, working with Tolin Mechanical, our boiler is and will be reliable for this upcoming winter.

We have begun to replace the shut-off valves under each of the sinks and hope to complete the plumbing work in the first quarter of 2017. We also have been working on the irrigation system, fixing leaks and sprinkler heads. We should have this completed before Thanksgiving and hopefully will have in-place a professional to maintain the system throughout the year.

In the Spring, the City of Arvada will be widening 60<sup>th</sup> Street to accommodate the increased traffic from the opening of the new Light-Rail station located across the street from the church. The through put of cars and people will present a great opportunity for Simpson's outreach. However, we will be exposed to the construction of new sidewalks, driveways and the changes in our grass areas.

This year, the ONE committee and the Trustees and the entire congregation got together and sponsored our first Golf Tournament. The proceeds went to the boiler fund. It was a lot of work, but it was also a lot of FUN. We hope to put together another tournament this coming year.

On a more positive note, our facility has been very busy with activities from various community groups. Not only have many Japanese-American groups used our facility for their events and meetings, but groups having musical recitals, health fairs, talent shows, cultural events and various celebrations from graduation events and even birthday parties, to mention a few. It is good to share our place with the community and to get people to know that we are here and we are also a place of worship.

Finally, the Early College of Arvada (ECA) (the school across the parking lot) is beginning to use our facility more often. There is much dialogue that occurs between us and the ECA. One item that we will come together on is the sharing of the parking lot. We are in the process of putting together rules and an agreement surrounding the usage and the maintenance of the parking lot. We will finalize this in 2017.

Again, we want to thank the Trustees, Ken Namba, Hondo Swanberg, Todd Namba, Harry Hishinuma, Dennis Kitayama and all of the regular volunteers that come out to our Work Days and give of their time and expertise to keep this church facility running smoothly for all of us.
