TIIMS—What happens next?

In one of my first articles for this newsletter, I used the image of giving birth to illustrate the TIIMS process: the people of the church do the work of creating a new way of life while I act as a spiritual mid-wife, guiding and helping the process along. Well, we have been working the TIIMS process for nine months now. Is the baby ready to be born?

As with all new life, only God knows when the time is ripe for birth. When churches are reborn, they often only see the moment of birth long after it has taken place. With that in mind, I can tell you what some of the next steps will be, and help you prepare for the work. It is my prayer that this information will inspire you to participate in the days and weeks ahead, supporting your leaders as they seek to serve God by serving you.

Strategic Planning

Former and current Council members attended a Leadership Seminar in February. Led by Drew DiGiovanni, they took a step back from the issues challenging the church so they could better understand how we function as an organization. This work is called a "Cultural Assessment" - but it has nothing to do with ethnicity. Instead, it is a way of gaining a more complex and deeper grasp of how the people in an organization interact—whether for good or ill.

Out of that experience as well as the retreat the leaders realized that the church needs a Strategic Plan. The world around us has changed dramatically over the past 35 years. The structure and activities that used to bring success are no longer effective. Who are we called to be in the next 20 years? What will we have to do to be successful?

I trust that God will renew this church—but I also know that God will only work where He hears a "yes" to his invitation to new life. I invite you to trust God and say "yes," and then give yourself into God's hands.

I thank God for the opportunity he gave me to serve you. I pray for you every day, and my heart rejoices as I see the Holy Spirit moving among us, bringing hope and new life.

LIFE LINE SCREENING "Let's Be Healthy Together"

Life Line Screening, a leading provider of community-based preventive health screenings, will offer their affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings at Simpson United Methodist Church on May 18, 2018. Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis. Register for a Wellness Package which includes 4 vascular tests and osteoporosis screening from \$149 (\$139 with the member discount). All five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete.

More information about Life Line Screening will be provided by way of bulletin notices and emails as we get closer to the event.

Strategic Plan Where do we want to be? Where do we get there?

On February 11, 2018 an All Congregation SPRC Meeting was held. During this meeting a recommendation was presented to consider a Strategic Planning meeting which would strive to integrate themes, goals and objectives. This recommendation was presented to the Council who endorsed and agreed to sponsor a facilitator to lead the initial stages of this process. The "Vision" for the strategic plan has been incorporated and developed from feedback from the fall Church Retreat (Sept. 7,8,9, 2017) which was held at Buckhorn Camp and from the ongoing dialogue sessions held at the church.

The three phases are as follows:

A. Initial phase: Explore several key issues

B. Phase Two: Planning Stages

C. Phase Three: Implementation Phase

On April 21 a small group will convene and explore several themes, goals and objectives. The process is designed to cascade into "Phase Two: Planning Stages" which will allow a larger group to participate in the strategic plan. A report will be delivered to Counsel regarding ongoing progress. Ultimately this will assist the church in formulating both short and long term measurable goals.
