For the last two months during our worship services, we have been on a journey with Jesus. We have

heard what it is like to be a witness to God and how to be an expression of God's love in everyday life. We have heard the many ways that Jesus loved those that others have labeled as "outcasts". We continue our journey with Christ but now our path changes as we begin to head towards the cross.



The season of Lent is a 40-day season of soul-searching and repentance. It is also a time of study and prayer. The traditions of Lent date back to the second century where the faithful rededicated themselves, repented and committed to a renewed relationship with God. This season was also when new "converts" were instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. The 40 days of Lent is also a reminder of Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for 40 days. For centuries, Lent has been a journey to new beginnings.

Creating a Culture of Renewal defines a vision as a "Kingdom-oriented, imagined future condition in which a congregation serves God and reinvents the way it does ministry." A vision is a big picture idea that involves God. Our Pledge of Allegiance, "One nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all," is an example of a bold vision for our country.

A mission statement, by contrast, is the reason the church exists. The mission statement for the United Methodist church is: "Making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." This is the current reason the United Methodist Church exists.

What is the God-oriented vision of Simpson United Methodist Church (UMC)? As we enter this Lenten season that brings new life, our church is in the process of dreaming about a vision statement for Simpson UMC. Arriving at a vision is a process and a journey. It requires that we create space for new thoughts and ideas, maintain the willingness to see things from a new perspective and requires steadfast reliance on God.

Over the years, Simpson UMC has engaged in various visioning processes. What is different about our 2019 dreaming and visioning is that we are being intentional about creating a vision and then developing a plan and team that will implement the vision. Over the next several months, we will be engaging in various conversations to help us dream of our "God-sized" vision. I encourage you to be part of the journey as we dream of new beginnings.
