The symbol of the Easter egg is not found in the Bible, and yet it is a perfect example of promised life. It is life sealed away for a time before new life literally burst forth. The shell can be compared to a tomb in which life is held captive. When the shell is broken, new life is free to enter into a new world.

I am also reminded of the annual celebration of Ground Hog's Day which is the perfect example of hope. As much as he tries, Punxsutawney Phil cannot stop spring. As the temperatures increase and the harsh Colorado winter ends, we begin to see signs of spring. Small blades of green begin to emerge in the unkept brown carpet covering our lawn. The stems of crocus and tulip flowers begin to push through the wood chip mulch and debris that have collected by our front steps. The trees form buds from which young waxy leaves unfold. Spring brings brilliant colors and signs of new life.

The Lenten season is a time where we examine the truths of our faith. Jesus' resurrection is the key. We are transformed from our past by Christ's death and the power that brought Jesus back to life is available to us to bring new life. During Lent, we examine our lives and realize that before we can walk in new life, we must leave our old behaviors behind. We can't know the Resurrection without personally applying the Crucifixion. When we break the shell that holds us captive, emerge through the brown carpet of mulch and debris, and grasp the hand of Jesus, then we experience the power of new life.

I appreciate the photo below and the image of Jesus' journey to the cross. How many different symbols of the Lenten season do you see? The image portrays the nails, the thorns, heads hung in reflective remembrance of our past behaviors......then the cross and new life of Easter morning!

Often times, our lives are filled with many Lenten journeys and Easter awakenings. If we chose, each journey will lead us to the foot of the cross and new life. The question you have to ask yourself is this:

Are you willing to begin a new journey?

Have confidence that God offers us hope and new life....not just on Easter morning, but every day!

May it be so!

#### THE SONG EVERLASTING

"Music has always been a strong metaphor to teach lessons about life and faith. The chanting of psalms was a foundational part of Hebrew worship. The Apostle Paul used song illustratively as he encouraged the early church to live in harmony. From the upper room, distant tones of our Savior's voice could be heard as He and His friends sang into the shadows and found their song in the night.

Music reaches deep into our hearts and calls us to reflection. It surrounds us with sound and invites our spirits to soar in celebration. When shared with sincerity, song transcends the walls that separate us and builds bridges of understanding among all people. On the wings of music, we can express the deepest emotions of our lives and explore the victories and mysteries of our faith. In this cantata I have incorporated hymns, spirituals, and folksongs, and intersected these musical moments with the story of Christ's ministry among us. This exalted theme reverberates through the ages in echoes of assurance and its resounding glory is a magnificent never-ending alleluia that awakens in the believer the voice of praise".

These words from Joseph Martin gives us assurance that inspired the early poet to write:

...no storm can shake my inmost calm while to this Hope I'm clinging. Since Christ the Lord of

heaven and earth, how can I keep from singing. These words and thoughts from the composer of "The Song Everlasting" invite you to reach deep in your mind and soul as you hear "The Song Everlasting." Our cantata is divided into 3 sections: MINISTRY, HUMILITY and VICTORY. On Palm Sunday you will hear sections 1 & 2. On Easter you will hear the final section as we celebrate Christ's resurrection!




#### Notes from the Trustees:

The blizzard has passed, Spring is upon us and the Trustees are ready for the next cold snap by having the lower level kitchen HVAC system back in operation. The system is currently in the "off" position and to turn "on" please go to the small electrical panel located just above the microwave. Depress the button which will provide your needs, (i.e. vent, heat, cool, etc) If the heat is desired depress the correct button (diamond shape) and use the small gray knob to select temperature. Please use the black temperature mark near the dial for desired temperature setting. Upon leaving, please depress selected button and "off" button again to turn off system. All panel lights should go off. Thanks for your cooperation regarding this inconvenience.

The eight burner stove/oven is now in good working order. It is no longer necessary to contact a Trustee person before use. Thank you to all for your patience, however, should one feel an adjustment is required, please contact a Trustee.

Finally, the Trustees would like to request that when parking your car, please try not to park the front (or back) of the car over the sidewalk. This will make the sidewalks more usable, and keep people safe.

# Conference News

As many have already heard, the United Methodist Church's special General Conference voted to retain a non-affirming stance on same-sex marriage and ordination of LGBTQ+ clergy. This decision saddens me greatly as it excludes many of God's Brothers and Sisters and has hurt many people in our community and around the world.

Please know that the theology of exclusion is not a notation that is fully accepted across the global United Methodist Church. The ruling only received 55% of the votes, most of which originated in Africa, Asia and Europe. My theology is based upon unconditional love that God modeled through creation, Jesus' crucifixion, and God's unending passion to be in relationship with all of humanity.

Bishop Karen Oliveto and the Western Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church, the jurisdiction that includes the State of Colorado, has always embraced the theology that ministry is to be with all persons including the LGBTQ+ community. Below is a statement released by the Western Jurisdiction which clearly defines their position associated with the actions of the Special General Conference.

How will Simpson UMC respond to these actions? I hope you will prayerfully consider your personal opinions and share them with me. How can Simpson UMC continue to live into our belief that

Trusting in the Author of Life who understands the blessings of diversity we fail to comprehend, Inspired by the nonconforming Christ who teaches us to defy oppression in all its forms, and, Guided by the Holy Spirit who continually leads us by grace into abundant life,

We, laity and clergy, of the Western Jurisdiction of The United Methodist Church, as one body, deeply saddened and greatly harmed by the rending actions of the 2019 General Conference, reaffirm our commitment to a radically hospitable church in two converging ways.

As United Methodists, we must resist injustice and insist that the Church repent of the exclusionary principles of the Traditional Plan.

Grounded in our Wesleyan heritage, we will foster a new movement to gather the energy of inclusive United Methodists throughout our global connection.
