I am blessed to have had the opportunity to attend the 2019 Mountain Sky Annual Conference in Billings, Montana last week. Churches from Colorado, Montana, Utah, Wyoming and Idaho gathered together to celebrate the ministries of our local churches. Over 800 people worshiped and prayed as a Body of Christ as we dreamed of the future for our conference. We also prayerfully elected clergy and lay delegates for the 2020 General Conference and voted on petitions (legislation) that will guide the ministries in the Mountain Sky Conference.

Considering the recent approval of the Traditional Plan by the Methodist Church that retains a non-affirming stance on same-sex marriage and ordination of LGBTQ+ clergy, several petitions were reviewed and approved to define the Mountain Sky Conference's position on inclusivity and rejection of the Traditional Plan. In Petition MSC-10, All Are Welcome, the conference defined that all are welcomed into the full life of our congregations and annual conference, regardless of gender identity, sexual orientation, or where they are on their faith journey. The petition also defines that the conference will support the clergy of the Mountain Sky Conference who choose to conduct same-sex unions and that the conference will take no disciplinary action against the clergy. The petition also states that the conference will affirm calls to ministry based solely on the discernment of the gifts and graces necessary to fulfill that call. This petition clearly defines, in writing, how the conference has been serving and operating for many years. Petition MSC-09, Moving Towards God's Good Future, directs the Mountain Sky Conference to create a team to develop options for moving forward as an inclusive church that includes (1) partnering with other like-minded bodies, (2) developing legislation for General Conference 2020, and (3) separation from The United Methodist Church, which embraces the Traditional Plan. The conference also approved Petition MSC-03, The Calculation and Payment of General and Jurisdictional Apportionments by the Local Church/ Charge. This petition allows local churches to define and prioritize which ministries that 3% of our 13% apportionment will support. In these uncertain times, I am reminded of Matthew 14:27 where Jesus tells Peter to not be afraid. When Peter was given the unthinkable challenge to walk on water, Peter's first response was fear! Then Peter trusted Jesus, reached for his hand and stepped out of the boat onto the water. As a church, we have a choice in how we will respond. Will we respond in fear or will we reach for Jesus' hand? I am confident the Jesus' arms are stretch out waiting for the United Methodist Church to birth a new expression of ministry that is based upon unconditional love.

May it be so, Amen.

Tao Calligraphy Meditation Classes at Simpson UMC




Community Corner
