## Ad Council minutes (condensed) - 8/25/19

- -SPRC found a part-time choir director, who seems to be a good fit.
- -ONE Committee has been working on the potluck for the September 8th Keiro no Hi Celebration.
- -On September 15th, the youth will be helping anyone interested to sign up for the King Soopers rewards program to help raise money for mission projects.
- -ONE Committee continues to accept donations for the ongoing hygiene project.
- -Membership is critical to the Strategic Plan, therefore, George has been contacting outside people for ideas to increase membership.
- -The boiler installation has been delayed, because the Trustees are looking for a different company, since the current company has been non-responsive.
- -The charter school next door (ECOA) has signed a long term lease to use the church building for \$700 a month.
- -The property sale is still pending.
- -This church may have to make a decision soon about whether or not to stay with the Mountain Sky Conference.
- -The 2020 Mountain Sky Conference would like to share the Japanese American experience, such as internment, Governor Carr's role, and life after internment.
- -Invitation to participate in a meeting of Japanese based non-profit organizations, such as the Japan American Society of Colorado. Stacey Shigaya will represent Simpson.
- -Pastor Leah stated that the Conference would like to have more transparency by having laity from other churches in our conference meet on a routine basis.
