When I worked for the State of Wyoming, we were constantly reviewing our permitting process to ensure that the process was streamlined and effective. To evaluate our process, we utilized the Kaizen approach. Kaizen, meaning improvement, is a concept that strives to seek enhancement in all functions continuously. You may associate Kaizen with the Toyota Way.

Churches can fall into the trap of failure to adapt and change. The leadership structure of the United Methodist Church was created during a time when the church was centric in our daily lives. Now, churches compete with other priorities, including our grandchildren's sporting events, gardening, and other life events. Churches can also be distracted by the desire to seek consensus and lose sight of the church's vision. Churches must adapt their

structure to be lean, accountable, effective, and efficient if we desire to minister and impact our community and world. The decision-making process must also be nimble and ultimately resulting in implementing the vision of the church.

The Ad Council is currently considering modifying Simpson's leadership structure to a Simplified Church Structure. The Simplified Church Structure restructures our leadership committees by creating a Leadership Board and Ministry Teams. The board and teams function similar to a bicycle. The Simplified Church Structure will also help create of culture of efficiency, alignment and accountability. Please participate in our Ad Council meetings as we continue to learn



Simpson United Methodist Church Ad Council Minutes April 25, 2021 | 11am via Zoom

In attendance: George Kawamura, Stacey Shigaya, Charlotte Namba, Ken Namba, Karla Cornish, Owen FitzSimons, Dennis Kitayama, Pastor Leah Coleman

- 1. Opening prayer was offered by Pastor Leah for Dan Goto and his family.
- 2. Covid Update and SUMC Vaccine Clinic: Pastor Leah Second dose clinic has been rescheduled for May 1 in the morning; the afternoon will be for 1st doses with the 2nd dose date TBD.

3. Committee Reports

a) Finance:

March 2021 income was \$7700, which is \$5K less than in 2020. March 2021 expenses exceeded 2020 by by \$1500.

Dennis applied for forgiveness of our first PPP Loan. .

Dennis will submit a finance summary to be published in the next church newsletter.

b) Trustees

We need a new vendor to maintain our HVAC system. Having issues with our current vendor.

The catalytic converter was stolen from our van (model year 2000, not sure of current value). The trustees will discuss if we should keep/repair or sell the van.

There was a request to rent the church for a piano recital in June by a person who has rented the church in the past for recitals The approval was made a few months ago and the request form was completed and submitted

Still waiting for the adjuster to let us know about the replacement flooring regarding the pipes that burst in the downstairs kitchen on December 15, 2020.

- **c) O.N.E. Committee/Missions and Programs:** The O.N.E. Committee is still on break. Gardening project is ongoing; invite/info will be resent to the congregation.
- d) SPRC: Was not able to meet today, so they will reschedule their meeting.
- e) Membership: No update.
- **f) Lay Leaders**: Paula and Owen have not received feedback from the congregation after their article in the newsletter inviting people to contact them
- 4. Strategic Plan Team Reports
- a) Membership Team: Bible Study group will occur in May, dates TBD.
- b) Cultural Team: Game Night will be rescheduled to May 22 for Bingo. Calvin is organizing.

c) Stewardship Team:

Met with Maestro investment advisor; received several documents on our investments. Advisors' objectives for growth are 6-7% gains per year; we have asked him to look at a higher return and our risk tolerance. Parsonage account is draining faster than the monthly withdrawal.

Need to look at our 1) restricted funds and how they can be used (with Bob Fujioka's assistance), 2) funds with the UMC, and 3) Nichigo funds and informing those members of the church's financial situation.

5. One Board Concept:

A One Board concept looks at reorganizing decision-making and the structure of the church leadership by creating One Board that makes the primary decisions and has committees that allows

people to work on tasks. It uplifts leaders to be in the center of the decision-making process for the church. The decision to move to One Board needs to be discussed and voted on by the entire congregation and conference.

How does SPRC fall into the One Board plan?

It was suggested that the team leaders of the Strategic plan and committee chairs be included in the conversation to explore this One Board proposition.

This plan can decrease redundancy of committees.

The Strategic Plan should be considered in this process.

A One Board plan works from the top down (ie the board members), rather than the bottom up (ie the committees).

A One Board plan also brings accountability to decision making because the board would have the authority to make decisions.

The Book of Discipline allows us to form a One Board structure

Putting this plan together will also allow us to put structure, knowledge, processes, etc. on paper for future leadership.

At Next Ad Council Meeting: Determine who should be involved in this preliminary process as well as research needed to start discussing the plan.

6. Tree Planting in Memory of Dan Goto

The landscaping project from several months ago started with a way to save money by Xeriscaping around the church. This project was then tied into Charlotte's suggestion that we create a garden. Planting a tree in memory of Dan should be thoughtful both with the location and timing.

7. Other Business

Stacey will send pdf of Ad Council minutes to Paula for posting on the website, and will ask Mari to draft a summary that will be approved by Ad Council and then posted in newsletter. Volunteers have been working on the origami flowers for the Mother's Day fundraiser Update on approaching conference on assistance with what we can do to grow our church, etc

8. Closing Prayer by Pastor Leah

Want to hone your gardening skills, but would like to have some Church friends to talk with about it along the way?

The Missions and Program Team of the Strategic Plan wanted to hold a Zoom presentation on how to start a vegetable garden this spring. We couldn't find a presenter, but realized there are plenty of resources online. But that's a lonely search by yourself!

So... we came up with an idea to sign up for some "Simpson Garden Buddies". Joining with two or three or four other people to each grow some vegetables; compare notes; and at harvest time exchange some recipes! You'll see a page that asks for an "access code" which is: 7963

You might recognize that access code as the last four digits in the good old Simpson phone number. Oh, and you'll see a few random ads on that page since this sign-up service was free.



On the SignUpGenius page, you'll see listings for Tomatoes, Zucchini, Peppers, Corn, Cabbage, Daikon, Peas, Eggplant, Potatoes, Broccoli, Cucumbers, and Melons (we could add more if you have ideas). Each vegetable has five slots open. So to join in the fun, take the following steps:

- 1. Choose one, two or three vegetables you would like to grow this Spring and Summer, and sign up for one slot in your choice of any vegetable(s).
- 2. You'll sign up with your name and email, so we'll send you a notice at that email and you can get in touch with your four Garden Buddies by email and compare notes, make plans, and share resources via email.
- 3. As the season goes on, check your planting and growing progress together. Share your progress by phone, photos or email. And later, make plans for some recipes for your vegetable.
- 4. At harvest time, share a phone call, face time, or Zoom call to cook your recipe. And share a photo or two with Simpson. OR... maybe by that time we could have a distanced potluck in the parking lot or something like that!

In 2019, Congress directed the National Park Service to conduct a Special Resource Study to determine whether Amache meets the criteria to become a new unit of the National Park System. This is the first step to determine whether Amache qualifies for such a designation.



Please go to https://amache.org/site-planning/ for more information. Comments must be received by June 30, 2021 to be considered part of the study.
