Sakura Square LLC

As many of you are aware, Sakura Square and Tri-State/Denver Buddhist Temple representatives are actively working on the redevelopment of our block. In the coming days you may notice signs posted around the property regarding our application for a Certificate of Demolition Eligibility (CDE) for Sakura Square. If granted by the City of Denver, the CDE would provide us with a five-year window in which we can demo Tamai Tower and other commercial structures on the block. The CDE is the first step in a multi-year process regarding the redevelopment of Sakura Square, a project that will ensure the preservation of our Japanese American heritage for future generations. Most importantly, the CDE process will have no immediate impact on any of our existing commercial tenants or Tamai Tower residents as any demolition and construction are still years away. The Temple has previously applied for their CDE and has successfully received approval.

- Vienna sasuages (little cans)


- Canned instant foods like Spaghetti O's

Hygiene Kits

Once again the ONE Committee will be sponsoring a collection of hygiene articles. The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is a permanent committee who help in times of need for victims of natural disasters. All donations, financial and material, are used 100% for victim relief. UMCOR sponsors an ongoing project of collecting items for Hygiene Kits. The ONE Committee will have collection boxes in the foyer for donated items. Each kit will include the following:


- 1. One hand towel (15 x 25 to 17 x 27 inches)
 - No kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels.
- 2. One washcloth
- 3. One comb
 - Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth
 - No pocket combs or picks
 - Rattail and combs with handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth
- 4. One toenail or fingernail clipper
 - No emery boards or metal nail files
- 5. Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger)
 - No Ivory or Jergen's soap
 - Do not remove from packaging
- 6. One adult toothbrush
 - Do not remove from packaging
 - Personal advertising not acceptable
- 7. 10 adhesive bandages $(3/4 \times 3 \text{ inches})$
 - Common household bandages acceptable
- 8. One one-gallon size re-sealable plastic bag

Important Notes

- All items must be new
- Do not wash any of the items, as they will no longer be considered new
- Do not include any personal notes, money or additional materials in the kits
- Contents of kits or the container of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

As we return to in-person worship, we need your help to run things smoothly. Sign-up forms for January and February AV volunteers and Liturgists are on the credenza by the west door.




Step 1

Go to Simpson's website at www.simpsonumc.com and click on the "Give Online" button.




Step 3

Enter your payment information and click the "Continue to review" button.




Step 2


