Dear Friends:

On February 27th, Simpson had our first 2022 Town Hall Meeting. Town Hall Meetings help members be informed and engaged with the mission of Simpson, which is to "Create a Cultural and Spiritual Space for All."

Once the Christmas holidays are behind us, it is time to celebrate the many ways our ministries impacted our community and reflect on how to shape our ministries in 2022. The purpose of the meeting was to review the progress of achieving the goals defined in the Strategic Plan, review church leadership's roles and responsibilities, and develop guidelines to help members communicate more effectively without "doing harm" to others.

During the meeting, we identified "**WHY**" Simpson exists. Once we identify the Why, it helps to guide what we do. The conversation was a powerful and beautiful reminder of how the church has supported individuals and the community. Below is a summary of the reasons Why Simpson exists as a church.

Simpson is a "Safe Haven" that allows people to be themselves.

Simpson is a space for future generations to gather.

Simpson is a space that allows people to consider their identity and be transformed into a stronger, healthier "whole person."

Simpson promotes the Japanese American culture in a Christian way.

Simpson helps to preserve Japanese American history.

Simpson is an extension of our family.

Simpson is a space where we can learn how to get along with others.

We also reviewed the Strategic Plan to evaluate our progress in achieving the plan's goals. We affirmed that we will maintain the existing goals but reprioritize the goals to help guide our energy and resources.

<u>Updated Priorities for the Strategic Plan - February 2022</u>

Goal #1: Expand the SUMC congregation by attracting new individuals and families, re-engaging past members, and continuing the active involvement of our current membership.

Objective: By December 2023, develop plans and implement at least two new activities that will involve our present and future membership in 1) enriching the Japanese and Japanese American cultural community and 2) serving the local and broader community.

Strategies: This objective will address involving past, current, and future members in the activities and ministries of the church. This could include recruiting current and potential members to work on activities that interest them and finding ways to nurture and care for our members and friends. Efforts will be made to develop attractive projects for families that utilize a multi-generational approach.

Goal #2: Honor, support, and share our Japanese and Japanese American cultural legacy.

Objective: By the end of December 2023, develop a plan and implement at least one new activity that will involve our membership in enriching the Japanese and Japanese American cultural community.

Strategies: The plan could include finding new ways to share existing annual events (e.g., bazaar and Hina Matsuri). It could also include working with the Buddhist Temple and other Japanese American community organizations on shared programming, developing a Japanese American board to facilitate collaboration, and planning the future creation of a cultural center.

Goal #3: Serve our local and broader community through programming and ministry.

Objective: By the end of December 2023, develop a plan and implement at least one new activity that will involve our membership in serving the local and broader community.

Strategies: Continue to work with the Good Neighbor Program to enhance communication and service with the local and broader community.

Goal #4: Assure SUMC's continued viability through prudent fiscal management and responsible stewardship.

Objective: Conduct a stewardship campaign, and identify one additional new fund-raising activity. Develop a plan to lease the building to create a new income stream for the church.

Strategies: The stewardship campaigns will emphasize the strategic plan activities.

As you can see, the purpose of the church remains clear, and we have defined strategies to help us maintain the vitality of Simpson United Methodist Church. Please join me in your blessings and support for this great church!

Lil and I celebrate with you. After years of prayers and unyielding effort by you and others, Amache is to become a federal, historic site managed by the National Park Service. This will have many advantages, including financial support for perhaps restoring portions of the camp. It will enable the shameful Amache atrocity to be shared more widely.

Given the growing suppression of free speech, sharing the story could become difficult. There is a well-funded, well-organized movement of conservative activists who do not want what they consider the disturbing events of our history shared, especially anything that is racist. I know you will be strong and disciplined as in sharing the story.

Lil and I appreciate very much the time we spent at Simpson UMC. You, the people and experiences were life enriching. We will always cherish our time spent with you.





- Vienna sasuages (little cans)


- Canned instant foods like Spaghetti O's


