Mountain Sky Annual Conference Updates

Each year an equal number of clergy members and lay members attend their conference's annual conference session for worship, fellowship, and to conduct the business of the conference. These sessions include reports of past and ongoing work; adoption of future goals, programs, and budgets; ordination of clergy members as deacons and elders; and election of delegates to Jurisdictional and General Conferences. This year, the Mountain Sky Annual Conference will complete the conference business during two sessions.

The first session was held on June 16-19, 2022. The June session included opening worship, clergy session, laity session, a plenary session for legislative business, vision exploration with Bishop Karen, district lunches, the memorial worship service, and the Ordination worship. The second session will be on **October 21 – 22, 2022**. The second session will include:

- Presentations on the mission and ministry of the Mountain Sky Annual Conference
- Annual legislation, including the budget, nominations report, and guiding policies
- Voting on petitions, including church disaffiliations
- Confirming episcopal nominees for the upcoming Western Jurisdictional Conference (Nov 2-5th in Salt Lake City, UT)
- Visioning and commitment toward the future of the MSC

The Western Jurisdiction will elect up to four of its five bishops in November 2022. Given this unique opportunity, leadership from across the Western Jurisdiction has proposed a new process for annual conferences and the jurisdiction to work through a discernment process culminating in the election of its bishops. At the October session, the body will be endorsing one or more candidates for the Western Jurisdiction episcopal elections. Currently, there are six nominees that the body will consider for endorsement. Differences over same-sex marriage and the ordination of LGBTQ clergy have simmered for years in the United Methodist Church, coming to a head in 2019 at a conference in St. Louis where delegates voted 438-384 to strengthen bans on LGBTQ-inclusive practices. Most U.S.-based delegates opposed that plan and favored LGBTQ-friendly options; they were outvoted by U.S. conservatives teamed with most of the delegates from Methodist strongholds in Africa and the Philippines. In the aftermath of that meeting, many moderate and liberal clergy, churches, and conferences made clear they would not abide by the bans. Various groups worked on proposals to let the United Methodist Church split along theological lines. These disputes continue today, leading to various legal decisions.

COVID Study



Identity Statement of Simpson United Methodist Church (SUMC):

Simpson is a multi-culture church that embraces the Japanese American heritage and is committed to the continued existence of its history and traditions.

Job Summary:

- 1. Simpson is hiring a long-term Japanese language instructor to teach Japanese learners.
- 2. There are three class levels (min 15 years old): beginning, intermediate, and advanced. The class sizes vary from 1 to 10 students.
- 3. Each level meets for one hour on Saturday mornings (starting at 9 a.m., ending at 12 p.m.) at the SUMC building in Arvada (remote only when necessary).
- 4. There are Spring and Fall semesters, each with approximately 18 classes. There is a 3-month break in the summer and a short break over the holidays.
- 5. The position will begin in August 2022.

Responsibilities:

- 1. Maintain a friendly, fun, and positive experience for both the learners and instructor.
- 2. Be responsible for deciding the learning materials, curriculum, and teaching techniques to ensure engaging, fun, and effective Japanese classes.
- 3. Coordinate substitute teachers and makeup classes.
- 4. Help SUMC coordinate the administration of the classes.
- 5. Be a friendly, supportive, and patient teacher to learners and advisor to SUMC.

Qualifications:

- Japanese fluency and knowledge of Japan.
- Teaching experience (preferably in Japanese for adults).
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills.
