During the last week of September, I represented Simpson at the National Japanese American United Methodist Caucus (NJAUMC) Retreat in Burlingame, CA. This gathering was the first one the caucus had since before the pandemic. It was an exciting opportunity for me because I was finally able to meet pastors like Rev. Allison Mark (Faith UMC - Torrence, CA), Rev. Karen Yokota Love (Blaine Memorial UMC - Seattle, WA), Rev. Akiko Miyake-Stoner (United Japanese Christian Church -Fresno, CA) and others in-person. Our time together was spent deeply conversing about the future and how the caucus can support all member congregations. In addition, I met Bishop Roy Sano, who signed my copy of an essential Asian American theology book he edited in 1976. Many of these NJAUMC pastors have inspired and supported me since my internship at Simpson. Now, they are inspiring and supportive colleagues as I become Simpson's pastor and their newest colleague.

A meaningful and memorable part of my time with the caucus was spent with Rev. John Miyahara, who grew up at Simpson. While some of you may remember him as a "very naughty boy," he has become an important mentor and role model for me. He continues to serve in the US Navy and was recognized as a distinguished alum by the Boston University School of Theology in August. You can read about Rev. On the last day of the retreat, Rev. John offered a moving devotion for the caucus. In it, he reflected on his thoughts as he held his newborn son. As a father, Rev. John shared his hope that he would be able to give his son two essential things - roots and wings. While I cannot do justice to Rev. John's exact words, it left an impression on me about our life together at Simpson and how we bless the people we encounter. My experience of Simpson is that you are a community that is rooted in the Japanese American experience and also a community where all can discover and reclaim their roots. Being rooted in one's identity gives one the freedom to soar. I believe that Simpson continues to be a community that is a safe perch for all to soar from to freely to be and become the people God calls them to be.
