I miss her smile.

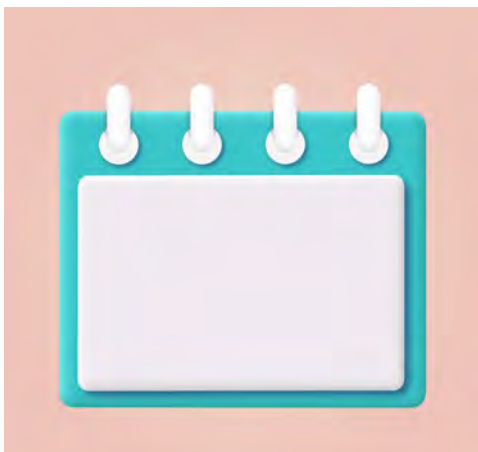
