ROOTED IN LOVE, RISING IN GRACE

Our culture often pressures us to be "special." Many of us, especially those who grew up in the "self-esteem era," heard messages like, "You're extraordinary! You can change the world!" While well-meaning, that constant push can be exhausting. Ordinary life doesn't always feel extraordinary, and social media only heightens the pressure, inviting constant comparison between our unfiltered lives and someone else's highlight reel.

The gospel offers a freeing alternative: in God's kingdom, you don't have to be special to belong. Colossians reminds us, "As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him." We receive Christ purely by grace—not because we've earned or achieved it. There are no gatekeepers in Christ. We belong because God has already claimed us.

United Methodists call this justifying grace—the moment we trust that God, through Jesus, has made us beloved children. The theological term imputation means Christ takes what is ours and gives us what is His. But grace keeps working. Sanctifying grace shapes our hearts over time so that love, mercy, and justice become part of our everyday lives. This isn't about trying harder—it's about letting God's Spirit set us free to love like Jesus.

Rooted in grace, we are freed from comparison, competition, and the need to impress. A grace-filled church becomes a refuge where people can breathe deeply and hear the truth: You are loved. You are welcome. You belong.

In a world weary from demands to "be more" and "do more," the church is called to be a living witness to God's radical welcome. Ordinary people, living out extraordinary grace together, show the world another way—a way rooted in love and rising in grace.

COLORADO HERITAGE FOR ALL

Next year marks the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence and the 150th anniversary of Colorado's statehood. As part of celebrating these two historic milestones, History Colorado started a new project called Colorado Heritage for All. The goal of this project is to identify 150 currently unrecognized spaces and places that tell the stories of communities of color, women, and LGBTQ+ Coloradans, and to add all of these sites to the state Register of Historic Places by the end of 2026. The Simpson building is one of these unrecognized spaces and places.

As part of this project, an intern with History Colorado will assemble the nomination packet with feedback and input from the Simpson community. The nomination packet will be submitted to the Colorado State Register Review Board for consideration.

Alesha Adolph is the History Colorado intern who will be assembling Simpson's nomination. To help her work, the following would be most appreciated:

- Historic pictures of the exterior of Simpson's building at its current location, especially pictures before the Memorial Lounge addition.
- Historic pictures of both sanctuaries from 1960s and 1970s
- Suggestions of individuals Alesha should speak to about congregational life in the building as she collects some oral history

LET'S DANCE CLASS


